Offering—The offering is an act of worship! We encourage you to place something in the offering plate as it come to you. Pens and notecards are available at the end of the pews if you would like to place a prayer of how you plan to be a good steward this week. You are invited to offer you prayer, tithes, and talents through the offering plate!

Facility Update—Great news! We are updating our building with a new sprinkler and fire security system. Please be aware of work areas throughout the church building during the month of May. We will be sure to communicate all space changes if needed.

Children in Worship—We have a "Children in Worship" guiding brochure available in the Narthex! This brochure is intended to serve as an aid to parents and other members of our congregation in welcoming our children to worship. Children are always welcome to wiggle and giggle in the pews at FPC! During worship children are invited to join us at the front of the Sanctuary for a time of Wondering with God's Children. Afterwards, children planning to go to the nursery will be escorted downstairs by Pastor Neeley or Pastor Erin. If you need help finding the nursery, you are invited to ask an usher to point the way. If your child needs to leave the Sanctuary for whatever reason, please accompany them throughout the building.

Accessibility—In an effort to make FPC a welcoming place for ALL of God's people we have removed a portion of one of our pews in the Sanctuary to make our space more accessible to wheelchair and walker users! We've also recently updated our sound system to have Bluetooth capabilities. If you'd like to learn about connecting your Bluetooth hearing aids to our Sanctuary sound system we invite you to talk to Dan Walden on the Tech Team.



DREAAM is designed to reach, teach and invest in African American boys at risk and to walk alongside them and their families beginning at the early age of three until they reach the age of 24. Tracy Dace, DREAAM's founder and CEO, calls gifts to the Pentecost Offering "hope in action."



The Young Adult Volunteer program is a faith-based year of service in sites across the U.S. and around the world that has been changing the lives of young people ages 19-30 for nearly three decades. Maggie Collins, who served at Presbyterian Ministry at the United Nations, said, "My home church has always put an important focus on social justice and the church's obligation to serve the greater community. This had a large impact on me and my conception of what it means to be a Christian."
